This past month, SCLA had a security incident involving our backend access. It has come to our attention that access to the administrative section of our accounts was breached. Since then, the Executive Board has met multiple times, and has taken the following steps to ensure this doesn't happen again:

- · Immediately upgraded password strength and access
- Removed multiple user access
- Updated our security procedures

I'd like to reiterate that this incident did not affect your personal, professional, or financial information that SCLA has access to. This has alerted the association to a weakness in our security procedure, and it was immediately rectified.

I'd like to personally thank all of you for your understanding and patience while the board works towards finding the most effective way to continue to be a resource for our members. One of SCLA's core beliefs is to be true to its members by being a fundamental resource for all library workers through quality education, professional activities, and responding to the needs of our members.

Our libraries and schools today across the country are facing attempts to restrict and censor materials - I wanted to reiterate SCLA's take on censorship:

The Suffolk County Library Association (SCLA) has been serving librarians, staff, and trustees of Suffolk County libraries since 1939. The Division of Academic and Special Libraries (DASL) recently sponsored a program at the Long Island Library Conference entitled Reuniting the Vanderbilts: A Case Study in the Rescue and Transfer of Archives From Dowling College to the Suffolk County Vanderbilt Museum. The presenters recounted the Dowling College archives journey from the closing of Dowling College to their permanent home at the Vanderbilt Museum in Centerport. The records included not only archives, but also college records from the original Idle Hour property owned by William K. Vanderbilt.

Bruce Seger, president of DASL, introduced the presentation and the organizer Nicole Menchise, LILRC Archivist. Nicole also took part in the presentation together with Janet Soley (Friends of Connetquot River State Park Preserve), Jo-Ann Carhart (Advisory Board Member of the Friends of Connetquot River State Park Preserve), and Paul Rubery and Killian Taylor (both from the Suffolk County Vanderbilt Museum). Information was also provided by Diane Holliday (Pollock-Krasner House and Study Center, Stony Brook University) who also played a key role in preserving the archives.

Ms. Menchise described the incredible journey of the archives which resulted in their being saved and finding a permanent home in an appropriate location, the Vanderbilt Museum. The program was well attended and DASL has received excellent feedback.

During the course of the day, President Bruce Seger was available at a conference booth to answer questions about DASL and oversee a fun addition, a cardboard cutout of Ben Affleck available for attendee photo op's


