Position Summary:

The Youth Services Librarian II is a professional, supervisory position responsible for implementation and evaluation of services, programs and collections for children ages birth-5th grade. The candidate should possess strong leadership skills and a thorough understanding of library trends in youth literature, technology, education and community engagement. Position reports directly to Librarian III, Head of Youth Services.

Responsibilities:

- Plan, coordinate, present and evaluate innovative programming for children and families.
- Directly supervise professional and paraprofessional staff.
- Assist in management and maintenance of Youth Services collections.
- Provide exceptional customer service at public service desk, including reference, readers' advisory, and technology assistance for children, caregivers, and educators.
- Build relationships with schools and community organizations to promote library services. Represent the library at community events, professional meetings, and through outreach initiatives.
- Work collaboratively with other departments.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Master's Degree in Library Science (MLS) from an American Library Association accredited program.
- Valid New York State Public Librarian's Professional Certificate.
- Must be reachable on Suffolk County's Librarian II Civil Service list.

This position is 35 hours per week and includes daytime, evening and weekend hours.
