# Computer and Technical Services

This summer was a busy and engaging season for CATS. We kicked things off with a well-attended Technical Services Roundtable (TSR) meeting on June 12 at SCLS, drawing 21 participants. On July 30, 31 library professionals gathered for Navigating the Future: Embracing Emerging Technology in Libraries at SCLS, where Anthony Giansante, Sara Fade, and Steve Alcalde highlighted strategies for adopting new tools and supporting staff. We closed out the season with a CATS & SSD Makerspace Roundtable collaboration on August 22 at the Mastics-Moriches-Shirley Community Library, which brought together 32 attendees to share ideas, showcase projects, and discuss the present and future of makerspaces in our libraries.

Looking ahead, fall is packed with opportunities to connect and learn. On Wednesday, October 1 at 11am, we'll tour the Learning Commons Makerspace at Connetquot Library. Rogers Memorial Library will host a joint East End Tech Coalition (EETC) and TSR meeting on Thursday, October 9 at 10:30am, followed later that day by an online TIFF session at 2pm. CATS members will also be presenting at NYLA in November, including another round of Navigating the Future: Embracing Emerging Tech in Libraries and Creative Tech Solutions for Tight Budgets, with Anthony Giansante, Dave Jones, and Steve Alcalde. Rounding out the year, we're very excited to announce that our CATS Annual Meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 3 at SCLS, featuring NYLA Director AnnaLee Dragon speaking on ebook legislation, plus a special vendor "petting zoo" with CCP Solutions. 
YASD is excited to announce our upcoming Fall and Winter events!


Join us for our next meetup on Wednesday, November 19th, from 10:00 AM to
